How will the Nogales annexation affect our District?

If the annexation goes through it would mean that the RRMFD would be losing out tax revenue from the residents in the annexed areas since NSFD would be the ones responding and providing fire and medical services. The Annexation would definitely have an impact on our district and may lead to budget cuts.

As high winds continue, burn permits have been indefinitely suspended until restrictions are lifted. The National Weather Service issued Red Flag Warnings of critical fire conditions for parts of Utah, Arizona, Colorado, Kansas, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas. Those conditions are a combination of strong wind, low relative humidity and dry vegetation.

The Santa Cruz Regional Fire Academy students are scheduled to graduate in August. We have six FF/EMTs to be added to help fill our roster.


